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The Highest Principle is that which appears to be unattainable most of the time but manifests as we embark on the journey and walk in the way. The synthesis of the spiritual and physical understanding of our purpose, individually and collectively, is the most challenging aspect of this path. I have found this to be true in all cases, religious or spiritual paths, and uniting the Highest Principle with our carnal avatar in the flesh is often met with overwhelming aversity and opposition. "Until the past decade, experimentalists had not confirmed that quantum behavior persists on a macroscopic scale. Today, however, they routinely do. These effects are more pervasive than anyone ever suspected. They may operate in the cells of our body." (Vedral, 2011, para. 2)

The philosophical method of analysis of our purpose in life is something that is more difficult to quantity and measure. This form of exploration is one that is more idiosyncratic and unique to the individual. Whatever one believes and however they get there, some fundamental truths should be acknowledged along the way. connection, we are all connected. Belief in the unseen is not required for it to exist. Adherence to something greater and beyond our understanding is the humility that can conquer our hubris.
